


# Knowledge Organiser Year 4 Geography: Rainforests: Understand the water cycle

Key Vocabulary	
Things we already know	New vocabulary
Physical geography	natural features of the land
Water cycle	The journey water takes from land to sky and back again. The cycle consists of evaporation, condensation, precipitation and collection.
Evaporation	Water is heated and turns from a liquid into a gas called water vapour. The water vapour moves into the air.
Condensation	Is the process of water vapour cooling down and changing into a liquid.
Precipitation	The release of water from the sky. This can be in the form of rain, sleet, snow or hail.
Groundwater	Some of the water from precipitation will soak into the soil as groundwater this will move slowly towards streams and rivers
Runoff	Run off is the precipitation that falls on land and flows downhill towards stream channels which join rivers and eventually reach the oceans.
Rainforest	A forest habitat found in a warm place, full of tall trees and leafy plants it also has a lot of rain.
Climate	Climate is the unusual or average weather conditions over a long period of time.
Weather	Weather is the specific condition on a given day.


# Knowledge Organiser Year 4 Art: Rainforests Concept: Colour

Key Vocabulary	
<b>Rainforest</b>	a dense forest rich in biodiversity, found typically in tropical areas with consistently heavy rainfall.
<b>Texture</b>	Artists use texture in their art to help tell a story and to add dimension to a piece.
<b>Leaf</b>	A green blade like structure attached to the stalk or branch as part of a plant or tree.
<b>Flowers</b>	The seed bearing part of a plant – can also be known as blossom.
<b>Primary Colours</b>	All other colours are made from these. They cannot be made by mixing other colours. Red, blue and yellow are primary colours.
<b>Secondary Colours</b>	A colour made by mixing two primary colours. Red and yellow = orange Red and blue = purple Yellow and blue = green

## Concept: Evolution

Key Vocabulary	
<b>organisms</b>	This is another word that means living things.
<b>life processes</b>	The things that living things do to stay alive.
<b>habitat</b>	The specific area or place in which particular animals or plants may live.
<b>environment</b>	An environment contains many habitats and these include areas where there are both living and non-living things.
<b>endangered species</b>	A plant or animal where there are not many of their species left and scientists are concerned that the species will become extinct.
<b>extinct</b>	When a species has no more members alive or the plant, it is extinct.
<b>classification</b>	This is when plants or animals are placed into groups according to their similarities.
<b>vertebrates</b>	Animals with a backbone.
<b>invertebrates</b>	Animals without a backbone.
<b>specimen</b>	A particular plant or animal that scientists study to find out about its species.
<b>characteristics</b>	The distinguishing features or qualities that are specific to a species.

<b>Sin</b>	Offence against God – something bad.
<b>Holy Week</b>	The week between Palm Sunday and Easter.
<b>Palm Sunday</b>	The Sunday before Easter that celebrates Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem.
<b>Good Friday</b>	The Friday before Easter commemorating the crucifixion of Jesus and his death.
<b>Easter Sunday</b>	Commemorating the resurrection of Jesus from the dead.
<b>Salvation</b>	Preservation from harm, ruin or loss.



The egg, an ancient symbol of new life, has been associated with pagan festivals celebrating spring. From a Christian perspective, Easter eggs are said to represent Jesus' emergence from the tomb and resurrection.
